

# Rainbow Card

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## Stampin' Up! Supplies:

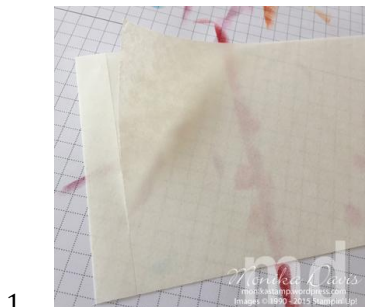
**Stamps:** Yippie Skippy

**Ink:** Brights Color Family pads, Memento Black

**Card Stock:** Basic Black, Whisper White

**Accessories:** Big Shot die-cut machine, Adhesive Transfer Sheets, Magnetic Platform, Stripe Scallop Thinlit Die, Labels Collection Framelits, Paper Piercer, Stampin' Pierce mat, Sponge Daubers, Painted Blooms Cotton Twine, Festive Piercing Templates, Dimensionals

## Using the Transfer Sheet



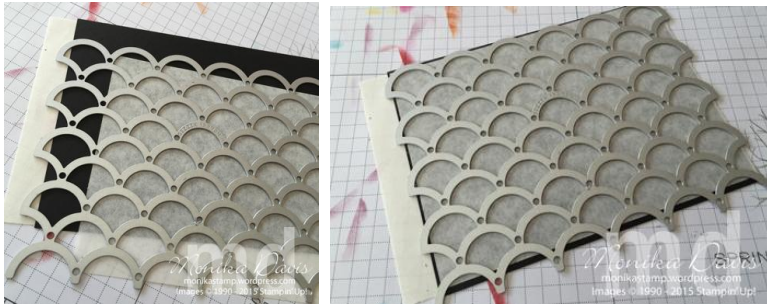
1.

Find the seam for the protective cover and peel back to expose the adhesive.



2.

Attach card stock to the adhesive. I used Basic Black card stock for this card.



3. Layer the Striped Scallop Thinlit die over the card stock with the adhesive transfer sheet. In between I added the protective cover which will act like wax paper to help the card stock release out of the die – or use wax paper. Place everything between two Big Shot Cutting Plates.



4. Place on the Magnetic Platform and run through the Big Shot Die Cut Machine. This will cut the Striped Scallop design into the card stock (and through the cover/wax paper piece).



5. Remove all the pieces of the cover/wax paper from the card stock also clean out your die so it will be ready the next time you use it.



6. Carefully lift the cut design off of the transfer sheet it will have the adhesive on the back of it.



7. Attach to the front of your card or card layer. Press everything down to make sure it's nicely attached. I have mine on a Whisper White layer that will go on the front of my card base.

## Creating the Rainbow



1. Gather the ink pads for the colors you want to use. The Stampin' Up! Brights family makes the perfect rainbow! I also got a sponge dauber for each color. I use a piece of washi tape to label my daubers.



2. Pick up a dauber with your finger and rub it into the ink on the ink pad. Then rub it on your card stock where you want the color. I like to use a circular motion when I do this – basically going in little circles in each area until I have the amount of color I want. Go back to the ink pad to pick up more ink as you need it. I started with Real Red at one edge of my design.



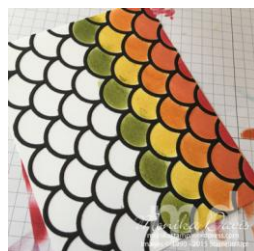
3. Move to the next color. Here I'm adding Tangerine Tango.



4. Continue through the rainbow of colors. This one is Pumpkin Pie.



5. Daffodil Delight



Old Olive



Bermuda Bay



Tempting Turquoise



Pacific Point



Rich Razleberry



Finish with the Melon Mambo on the end.

- Then finish your card. I attached the whole panel to a Basic Black card base.



Then I added the greeting which is from the Yippy Skippy stamp set. It was cut with the Label Framelits along with a Daffodil Delight layer. The Daffodil Delight layer is pierced using a template. I used the Cotton Twine in Whisper White to tie around the front of my card.
